


From The Editor:

Where We Have Been:

Back in the spring of '96 Alice (Coleman) Henning, '56, Lillian (Demers) Seaborne '56 and Marge (Maynard) Miller '56 got together and decided to try to find some of their former classmates and hold a reunion. Charlie Main '56 joined the group in 1997 and the project continued. After much research, planning and organization the class reunion was held on August 23, 1997 with 52 alumni from the classes of the '50s. Total attendance was 70.

The event was a total success and it was then decided that we needed to reestablish the alumni association. Since the old alumni association was disbanded back in the '80s there was much work to be done with locating former students.

A second reunion was held in September 2000 and we were well on our way with our goal of reconnecting the many long lost friends and classmates from the Aggie.

Where We Are Now:

We publish a newsletter in January and June. We have a presence on the Internet with our web site. We maintain a database of all located classmates. We provide a means for any former Essex Aggie student to contact their former classmates.

Where We Are Going:

At the present time the question of where we are going is unknown. With a current database listing of 368 found classmates we have only had paid memberships numbering 42 in 1999, 31 in 2000 and 43 in 2001. With a paid membership of less than 12 percent the ability of the association to continue is seriously in doubt. Due to the generosity of a few who have contributed their time & effort and those that have made individual donations over and above their membership dues we have been able to make it this far.

The Teachers

Christos P. Mpelkas, 80, died last January. He was a 1939 graduate of Lynn Classical High. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree in horticultural science from the University of Massachusetts and his Master's degree in plant physiology from the University of Connecticut. Mr. Mpelkas began his career as chairman of the Vegetable Crops and Science Department at Essex Aggie.

He later served as resource development specialist with the extension service of the University of Massachusetts. He was considered to be an international authority on the effects of radiant energy on plant growth. He traveled worldwide as a speaker and project developer on plant growth systems for greenhouses and totally enclosed structures. He has written over 55 articles on lighting technology on plant growth responses.

Mr. Mpelkas was employed by the Sylvania Corp. For over 30 years before retiring from GTE Sylvania in 1990.

Alfred P. Muldoon, 79, died last March. Mr. Muldoon was a teacher at Essex Aggie for 37 years.

A Letter From The Treasurer:

During the past several weeks, Alice, Charlie and I have been engaged in a discussion about the lack of participation by so many of you Aggie alum out there. One thought that we had was that you had questions about the dues structure and where the money is going. To help answer your questions I've put together a few financial facts that I think you will find interesting.

Those of you who attended the reunion last year paid a total of \$2,000.00.

The cost of producing that event and the follow up activities such as the report mailed to each of you was \$2,540.46. Fortunately, thanks to the generosity of some of our alum, we had donations that have covered those excess costs.

Since our formal beginning in early 1999 memberships have brought in a total of \$2,400.00 in dues. Interest income of \$4.74 has raised the total to \$2,404.74.

The day to day expenses of running the organization, postage, the news letters, the cost of hosting our web site have cost us \$1,580.87 leaving us with a net operating balance today of \$823.87. Please bear in mind that we have two to three more newsletters to go for this calendar year. Bottom line, we are likely to just barely squeak through for the year.

But wait, we haven't figured in the cost of maintaining our web site. At the present time Charlie Main works away at what he likes to call a "labor of love." But what if we had to pay someone to do that work? Charlie tells me that he puts in about 30 hours per month to keep us informed and entertained. That's 360 hours minimum per year! If you have been at all involved with web services you know that we could easily be looking at \$25-\$50 per hour for those services. Were that the case we would have to either give up the web site, something that most of us don't want to see, or drastically raise the dues.

Fortunately we are not in that situation. But as you can see we are not building a big fat bank account either. Your dollars are working hard and we are happy to add our volunteer efforts to help make those dollars go further. So what are you doing? Have you joined yet? Do you want to have a live and financially viable alumni association? If so, then get out your checkbook and sit down and write out a check of the very small amount of \$20.00 payable to the Essex Aggie Alumni Association and get it into the mail to us. For less than the price of a carton of cigarettes, a couple of six packs or a restaurant meal you can be a part of your Alumni Association.

We'll be waiting for you!
